Dear Partner,

Grace and peace to you and yours.

From the beginning, God's purpose and will for His entire creation is revealed in His command to **“Be fruitful and multiply....”** Nothing is here just to be idle and take up space. Every part of His creation (*if it develops and matures properly*) will produce fruit and reach the ability to reproduce itself. This is His wisdom, and this is His will.

“I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit; for without me ye can do nothing. Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain; that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you.” (John 15:5,16) **“Wherefore by their fruits ye shall know them.”** (Matthew 7:20) As far as the Lord is concerned, it's not our ideology or theology, not our intentions or convictions about things that matters, but what we actually produce. It's what we do with what we have. The scripture tells us we should be **“...making the very most of the time and seizing (buying up) the opportunity.”** (Colossians 4:5 AMP)

The key to this efficiency is a constant communion with Him. As we fellowship with Him daily, He gives us His wisdom and grace. This wisdom reveals to us what is valuable and a good investment of our time, and what would be just throwing it away. A wise person won't spend what is precious and irreplaceable on something that is common and worthless. If we only live for life in this world, we'll lose our opportunities to serve Him, and ours will be a life wasted. If we give up things of this world to do His will, it'll be a life well spent. (Mark 8:35)

Another key to fruitfulness is being free from things that are a drag and drain on us. Deadness should be pruned so we can produce the most for the Master. **“... let us strip off and throw aside every encumbrance (unnecessary weight).”** (Hebrews 12:1 AMP)

I've included a message from the series on “Fruitfulness.” I pray it ministers to you and helps you to get free and get busy for Him to an even greater degree. The time is short. Let's make the most of what remains.
